

Morris Walters Retires After 36 years With the Boone County Landfill

Morris Walters served as foreman of the Boone County Landfill from its construction in 1970 through his retirement in April of 2006. He originally worked for his uncle, Tom Walters, the private operator of the landfill from 1970 until 1990. In 1990, Boone County assumed operational control of the facility and the operators became county employees.

Morris was quoted as saying that he, "never wanted the landfill to be an embarrassment to his grand kids." Scott Smith, director of the Boone County Landfill had this to say about Morris, "He always strived to operate the landfill in a clean and orderly manner."
